Important Information from the Office of the Governor (Washington State):

Face masks/coverings are required for common public settings and maintaining 6 feet of physical distance from others, to help prevent the spread of the coronavirus.

Statewide case counts and hospital admissions are increasing.

Cases associated with <u>variants</u> of concern (disease strains that may spread faster, cause more severe illness or affect antibodies' ability to recognize the virus) are increasing.

Everyone 16 and older eligible for vaccine. Johnson and Johnson available again in Washington. In Home Vaccine Available to those with challenges reaching vaccine locations. Call the King County COVID-19 Call Center at 206-477-3977 between 8 AM – 7 PM PST, every day to schedule an appointment.

NEW COVID STRAIN! A new variant of Covid 19 has been identified. It is currently thought that the existing vaccines should provide protection against these new strains; Covid precautions should continue!

New Roadmap to Recovery Plan – King County is in Phase 3. Rolling Back to Phase 2 is imminent with increasing numbers of new cases and hospitalizations in King County. Pierce County has already rolled back. https://www.governor.wa.gov/sites/default/files/HealthyWashington.pdf. Phase 3 means many businesses can now open at 25 % with limited indoor consumers.

NEW Inslee Issues Restrictions. Beginning - 3/22/21 - PHASE II Mask and Social Distancing Required

- **Sports Spectators** will be allowed to attend outdoor venues with permanent seating with capacity capped at 25%. The change effects both professional and high school sports, as well as motorsports, rodeos, and other outdoor spectator events. Social distancing and facial covering are still required.
- Indoor Social Gatherings 50% Occupancy or 400 max for large venues. Social distancing and mask required.
- Restaurants and Bars Indoor dining 50% occupancy
- Fitness Facilities and Gyms 50 % occupancy
- Indoor Entertainment Establishments (movies, concerts, museums) 50% Occupancy
- Weddings and Funerals 50 % occupancy
- Religious Services 50% occupancy
- Personal Services 50 % occupancy.

Inslee extends eviction moratorium, public utilities proclamation. Gov. Inslee announced the eviction moratorium and public utility proclamations will continue through **June 30, 2021**.
